She was in this country for 40+ years and managed to do JUST fine only ever knowing a few key phrases/words in English. We joked she was “strong like bull” but truer words have never been spoken.

I am beyond grateful she was there to see me graduate from college and get married even though she was in a lot of pain for the latter and had to make cross country treks to do both. She was able to meet & love & spoil my daughter and even though she never had a chance to meet my son, I know she loved him immensely in the 12 short weeks their lives overlapped.

I could go on but I'm sure at this point I'm just writing this for myself so I will end by saying ja kocham ciebie Babcia. You have always been and will always be a part of me and I will miss you for the rest of my days.
