Edward and his wife Margaret lived their Catholic faith and were very active supporters of St John's Church in NYC near Madison Square Garden and several charities. He enjoyed spending time with Margaret exploring shops and stores. He loved to travel and spend time at the beach. Edward loved his extended family and was always invited and present during family functions and celebrations. Edward had a great sense of humor. With a twinkle in his blue eyes and a heart of gold, he was always very affirming and interested in others. Edward will be dearly missed by his family.
