“ Dear Gerbino Family,

*My name is Joyce (Vitale) Weinrich. Maria and I attended the College of St. Elizabeth together and she quickly became my best friend. Maria was my maid-of-honor when I married and the Godmother of my first born daughter, Sarah. I spent the night and had dinner several times at Maria's family home during our college years and beyond. I loved and admired Genevieve so much for her faith and her big beautiful family. As a young wife and mother she was such an inspiration to me.*

*After going to see Mother Angelica, at EWTN, Genevieve bought me a little Rosary prayer book called, "My Rosary to Our Lady". She came up with Maria for a visit to my home and brought me the little book, sometime in the mid 1980's. To this day it still sits on my night stand all tattered and torn and print fading away from almost daily use through all these years. This past Lent, while using this Rosary prayer book, as I recited the Rosary, I felt the Blessed Mother encouraging me to consecrate myself to Jesus through her. So I used a book called "33 Days to Morning Glory", by Fr. Gaitley, to help guide me through this consecration. The book recommended that you start 34 days before a Marian Feast Day, so that on the feast day you make your consecration. (You prepare for 33 days, and consecrate on the 34th.) I chose to start on April 10th so I would make my consecration on May 13th, the Feast of Our Lady of Fatima. My plan was to make my consecration at the Blue Army Shrine in Washington, NJ. I was also going to go to confession there before mass. But then I received the news of Genevieve's passing and the day and time of her funeral mass. I realized that it was the Blessed Mother's plan that I consecrate myself to Jesus through Mary at Genevieve's funeral mass!! I now had to make a new plan for confession. I called the "Sanctuary of Mary" which is five minutes from my home, here in Branchville. Fr. Sylvester Livolsi was a dear friend of Paul and Genevieve's and he was also the founder and literally, the builder of the Sanctuary of Mary!!!! I had my confession in the sanctuary, at 7:30 Thursday night, right under Fr. Livolsi's portrait!! How beautiful!! What a miracle, how it all came together!! Thank you, Genevieve for once again touching my life in*

*such a beautiful and powerful way, through your gift of the little Rosary book and how it led me to consecrate myself to Jesus through His Blessed Mother, Mary!! The process and timing of it all was a TRUE MIRACLE!! God bless you, Genevieve and the whole Gerbino family!!*
