With the meds she had been on, it was hard for her to keep her eyes open. It was difficult for my sister and I, but I can't begin to imagine how hard it may have been for her. Such a tough cookie she was. A true fighter until the bitter end.

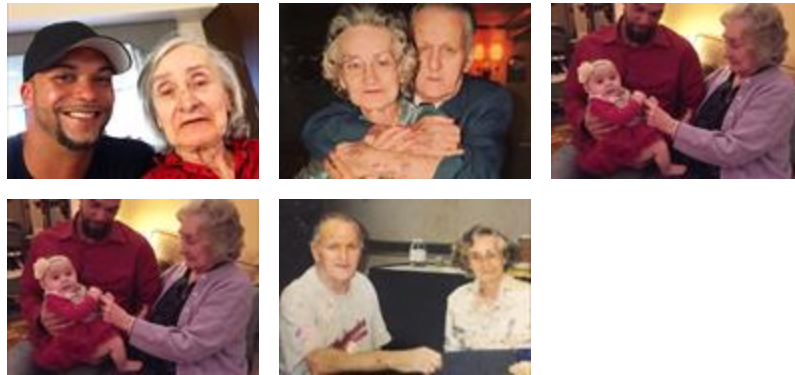

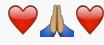
